January: Good Samaritan

Mealtime card

- Who are the good Samaritans in your community?
- When have you been a good Samaritan?
- Can you think of a time when you have been a good Samaritan just by being with someone? What did you learn?

Take-home idea

Consider where you live, work or go to school and see if you can identify someone who needs a friend right now. Consider how you could be that friend.

Question to start and end the session

So... what does being a good Samaritan look like for us?

February: Choosing God's voice

Mealtime card

- Which of the following is most tempting: a) a year's supply of chocolate, b) catching up with the laundry pile, or c) checking your notifications.
- What does the word 'temptation' mean, and have you ever been tempted to do something you know you shouldn't?
- What was Satan trying to get Jesus to do in the story?
- Which voice did Jesus listen to? God's voice in the Bible or Satan's? How can we make sure we're also listening to the right voice?

Take-home idea

For the next month, prioritise time to go on a few family outings to fun/special places and spend some intentional time exploring questions of faith. You could use one of the Messy mini-books (see more on p. 4) to aid your discussions. During these times, discuss what things you find unhelpfully tempting and what each person struggles with. Explore if these things get in the way of getting to know Jesus better. How can you hear God's voice as a family?

Question to start and end the session

So... if God spoke to you today, would you know it was him speaking?

- Talk to people at your table about the story of Naomi and Ruth and how God helped them.
- Tell someone about a time when you became aware of God working in your life.

Take-home idea

As a family, come up with a way that you can provide practical support to a person you know who lives alone, e.g. mow their lawn, invite them to a meal or make a cake.

Question to start and end the session




1. Gaekkebrev (snowdrop letter)

Reminds me that I am to love my neighbour as I love myself.

A button

Reminds me that when I accepted Christ, he fastened me securely to himself.

Silver

God's a refiner and the purifier or silver. He wants to see his reflection in me.

Birthday candle

To celebrate the day I became a new creation in Christ.

A nail

Reminds me of the shame and suffering that my Saviour endured for me.

A plaster

A flower

To remind me that as God clothes the flowers in the field, so does he provide for my needs.
