### **May: Down by the river**

#### **Mealtime card**


















## **May: Down by the river**

### 8. Tegre board game instructions

This is an Ethiopian game. Players sit facing each other in front of the egg carton (two rows of six holes). Start with four seeds in each hole. You each have six pits that are 'yours' and the hole to your right is where you'll put the captured seeds (the hole to your partners right is theirs). The goal is to get as many seeds in your pit as possible.

Each player starts by choosing a hole on his or her side and picking up all the seeds in that hole. Then moving in a counterclockwise direction, they deposit them one by one in the following holes (as if taking a lap around the holes).

This player continues to pick up seeds and place them in holes until the last seed goes into the empty hole. When the last seed of the turn is placed in an empty hole there are three possibilities:

- 1. If the hole is on your opponent's side, the turn is over
- 2. If the empty hole is on your side, and the opposite side empty, the turn is over
- 3. If the empty hole is on your side but the opposite cup has some seeds in it, you get to capture the seeds and place them to your pit (to the right).

The whole game ends when one row is empty.

#### **Mealtime card**

- How do we encourage each other when the going gets tough?
- How are we going to reach out to the 'outsiders' in our communities?
- How do we talk about faith in our families?

#### Take-home idea

This week, in our families, think about being practical in our faith. When we pray, let's have faith that God hears and answers our prayers. Take the word search home and contemplate on today's passage as you read the words you find. Ponder about what we as disciples are meant to learn from this passage.


### Question to start and end the session

So... how do we show both faith and works in difficult situations?




































### **August: God vs water**
