

Handout sheet—God's power to change

We are thinking today about the story of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit came to help Jesus' friends. God's Spirit is a gift for everyone, to help them and give them power to do things that seem too hard.

- 1. Air racing—Race your ball with unseen power.
- 2. 'Allsorts' of faces—God needs allsorts!
- 3. Plastic-bag kites—A kite for a windy day.
- 4. Power throwing—How can you use your strength for good?
- 5. Jelly fun—See water change to jelly.
- 6. All around the world—The Holy Spirit is for everybody.
- 7. Gift wrapping—Wrap a gift for someone special.
- 8. Blackout challenge—Do you need guidance?
- 9. Help station—What do you need and what help can you give?
- 10. Butter making—The miracle of shaking!



Handout sheet—The Philippian jailer

Today we're looking at the story of a jailer who found out what it meant to believe in Jesus. His life changed forever and he made a new start!

- 1. Paper chains—Jesus came to bring us freedom.
- 2. 'Get out of jail free' cards—A variation of the Monopoly card to remind us how Jesus frees us.
- 3. Freedom biscuits—We can invite Jesus into every area of our lives.
- 4. Family cutouts—God wants everyone to feel part of his family.
- 5. Cardboard swords—The jailer in today's story nearly had cause to use his!
- 6. Creepy creatures—Make some mice and spiders as a reminder of the unpleasantness of jail.
- 7. Thaumatropes—As the spinning slows, the prisoner is 'released'.
- 8. Prayer holder—It's good to remind ourselves that God answers prayer.
- 9. Prisoners and jailers—Use all your skill to stay out of prison or get someone else in there!
- 10. Friendship bracelets—A simple craft to remind us how the jailer became friends with Jesus.



Handout sheet—The fiery furnace

Today we're looking at the Old Testament story of three friends who refused to bow down to a king and paid for this by being thrown into a furnace. We discover that God is there in the most difficult situations, helping us to be brave.

- 1. Finger-painted fiery furnaces—The friends trusted God when they were scared.
- 2. Door hangers—A reminder that God is with us everywhere.
- 3. Telephone cups—Talking to our friends is important, but talking to God is even more important.
- 4. Three-legged race—Friends are important when facing life's challenges.
- 5. Musical instruments—God is worth our worship.
- 6. World rhythms—Music is used all over the world to worship God.
- 7. Prayer bonfire—Ask God to be with you when you are scared.
- 8. Junk statue—The big statue is impressive but God is even more impressive.
- 9. Flaming pizzas—When you eat this, think of the brave friends who stood firm.
- 10. Sand pictures—Fear should not stop us doing the right thing.



Handout sheet—The woman at the well

Today we are looking at the woman at the well and how her meeting with Jesus changed her life and the lives of people in the town where she lived.

- 1. Mosaic pictures—When little, broken pieces are put together they look good.
- 2. Edible wells—Think about the well outside the town.
- 3. Giant well—Working together on the model reminds us how the townspeople would have helped each other
- 4. Clay water jars—The woman went to fill her jar at the well and met Jesus.
- 5. Amazing stories—The woman told people about Jesus.
- 6. Jelly-bean conversations—The woman changed by talking to Jesus.
- 7. Peg-doll crowd—The townspeople went to see Jesus.
- 8. Ice-cube prayers—Jesus offers us living water.
- 9. Water-bottle challenge—Save your change to change lives.
- 10. Origami water bombs—Have fun with water.

Take on the challenge of completing the task you signed up for at the help station. Talk together about the things you feel are too hard or that you need help with. Thank God that his Spirit is always there to help and guide you.
