Give the invitation you made at Messy Church to your friend and encourage them to come along. You may want to make more invitations at home so you can invite more friends to join in the Messy fun!


SUNDAY TREAT



OCTOBER: ESCAPE!

MEALTIME CARDS

- What sorts of things make you feel scared?
- How do you feel when you are playing chasing games?
- What do you think the Israelites were most looking forward to about getting to the new home God had for them?

HANDOUT SHEETS

Today we explore God's magnificent rescue of his people, the Israelites, as they escaped from slavery in Egypt and the Egyptian army who tried to chase them.

WHAT ARE WE DOING TODAY?

- 1. Chariot—Can you imagine being chased by a chariot?
- 2. Clothes-peg horse—Make a horse to pull your chariot.
- 3. Junk chariot challenge—How quickly can your chariot travel?
- 4. Moses' walking stick—God used Moses' ordinary stick to part the Red Sea.
- 5. Egyptian shield—God is more powerful than a whole army!
- 6. Balloon sword—The Egyptian army came ready for a fight, but they were not ready for God!
- 7. Fishy collage—What did the Israelites see as they crossed the Red Sea?
- 8. Pebble prayers—We can bring our fears to God.
- 9. Pillar of cloud and fire—The pillar protected the Israelites from the Egyptians.
- 10. Track chase—God prevented the Egyptians from catching up with the Israelites.

TAKE-HOME IDEA

Watch the 1998 animated film *The Prince of Egypt* together (bearing in mind the PG certificate: young children may find some scenes too intense). This tells more of the story of Moses and the Israelites as God set them free from a life of slavery under Pharaoh. Talk about how the Israelites may have felt at each stage of the story, and how God kept his promise to set his people free and give them a brand-new life.

SUNDAY TREAT

Dear God, you promise to be with us when life is fun and easy, and when we are going through difficult times. Help us not to be scared, but to trust in you, as the Israelites did. We are not on our own, because you are always with us. Amen



HANDOUT SHEETS

Today's story is about a group of people who were captured and taken into slavery in a strange land. We'll explore how they felt as they sat by the river remembering their lost home.

WHAT ARE WE DOING TODAY?

- 1. Weeping willow—A place to share sadness with God.
- 2. Sadness wall-Praying about sad news.
- 3. Dry-mouth challenge—How many crackers can you munch?
- 4. Home sweet home—What would you miss if you had to leave home?
- 5. Transforming tears—Turn your angry scribbles into rainbows.
- 6. Handmade harp—Have you ever been too sad to make music?
- 7. Hanging teardrop—A reminder that it's OK to cry.
- 8. Find a way home—Make your way home through the maze.
- 9. Chains—How does it feel to be imprisoned?
- 10. Angry bubbles—What's the best way to deal with anger?

TAKE-HOME IDEA


Encourage your household to make a set of prayer stones. Everyone decorates their own pebble with paint or felt pens. At the start of each week, each person takes their stone and puts it on the prayer cairn to represent something they are praying for that week.


SUNDAY TREAT








HOME TEMPLATE

- How could you think about Jesus as you share your Christmas meal together?

HANDOUT SHEETS

Today we get ready for Christmas. Together we celebrate Jesus, who chose not to be a king in a palace, distant and remote, but instead to move into our local area, to be our friend and next-door neighbour.

WHAT ARE WE DOING TODAY?

- 1. Tweet the Christmas story—Christmas in 140 characters or less.
- 2. Jesus in our neighbourhood—Where is Jesus at work?
- 3. Pin-prick map—Spots of light glittering in a dark world.
- 4. Scrabble™ Christmas picture—Let's focus on Jesus this Christmas.
- 5. Shadow-puppet family—Putting Jesus at the centre of our family.
- 6. Sweet map—Jelly baby Jesus in an edible neighbourhood map.
- 7. Jesus candle holder—Reminding us Jesus is the light of the world.
- 8. Glory of God—A colourful picture to remind us how special Jesus is.
- 9. Word made flesh-Turn newspaper words into a papier mâché Jesus.
- 10. The world did not recognise him—Mask yourself to be as tricky to identify as Jesus.

TAKE-HOME IDEA

Just as we spent time today thinking of places to put our nativity scenes, perhaps as a family you could try to spot Jesus in your community. Where are all the nativity scenes? What others hints and clues are there of Christ in your neighbourhood? Posters? Signs in cars? Once you start looking you'll notice Jesus everywhere!

















TWITTER SPEECH BUBBLE TEMPLATE
